Aldrich Road Parking – Commissioner Motil

Joe Motil: Aldrich Road resident input

Before resident input Joe reviewed the background of the parking initiative. Joe has gathered info regarding restrictions on parking in the neighborhood. Joe sent an email on November 2, 2021 asking that residents "send a brief letter requesting restrictions". Only 3 people had contacted Joe until May 18, 2022. Joe monitored street especially in the spring. Businesses have towing signs and do not want student parking. OLP does not want student parking. Joe recommends supporting parking restrictions on Aldrich. Clintonville P&D could do a study on parking with the help of residents.

Resolution written by Joe to start discussion of issue by residents.

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- Diana Miller, Aldrich Road, Currently 10 streets have restricted parking; [Letter attached]
- Chuck Cohen, Aldrich Road, survey from 2021, was 2-1 in favor of parking restrictions
- Lacey Horig, Aldrich Road, the pandemic has worsened awareness of the parking problem, all other streets have restrictions
- Phil Hamilton, Aldrich Road favors restrictions
- Jan Patton, Aldrich Road in favor of restrictions
- Cary Foyle, Aldrich Road there is proof that emergency squads can make it down the road; parking does not affect real estate price
- Joann Pickering, Aldrich hazard to walk down the street, parking makes it difficult for trash and recycling trucks to get to bins
- Tom Miller, Aldrich never had an issue with safety on Aldrich Road, has never had an issue with his motor home; not a problem; on street parking comes with urban neighborhood; we need an overall study of the parking plan in the entirety of the neighborhood; restrictions only move the problem; asked that we send to Planning and Development
- Bob Patton, Aldrich Road contentious issue
- Phil Cook, Aldrich Road agrees with restrictions

Commissioner Comments:

Motil: Aldrich is 26 feet wide, no sidewalks, safety vehicles can get through, restricted parking can be undone by redoing the process.

White: urged folks to watch YouTube Channel Clintonville $- \frac{6}{24} \frac{2020}{200}$ – Zoning and Variance Committee meeting, BWHS promises; $\frac{7}{2} \frac{2020}{200}$ – CAC meeting, BWHS promised to take the weight off of the people of Aldrich Road; White thinks the citizens needs to put more pressure on BWHS

Resolution 2022-3: Motil moved to accept the resolution with second by Crowell

Crowell moved to amend the resolution:

Recommends to the city of Columbus that a comprehensive study on the impact of nearby schools parking in the Aldrich Road surrounding Aldrich Road be undertaken during the school year

Vote to accept the Amendment: 6-0-1 (White) Reason for abstention: not all avenues for a solution have been investigated

5. BZA22-092, 130 W. Henderson. The homeowner seeks variances from the rules requiring that:
1. Every "parking and loading space shall have sufficient access and maneuvering area (and that the) maneuvering area for a parking space may occur anywhere on a lot except in the area between the street right-of-way line and the parking setback line." CC3312.25;
2. "Where a required building setback line is less than 25 feet, the parking setback line shall follow the building setback line or the established parking setback, whichever is less, but in no case shall the parking setback line be less than ten feet from the street right-of-way line," CC3312.27(3);
3. The building setback be 20'. CC3332.21.
