Here's a draft of the agenda that I'd want to cover whenever we can meet:

- 1. Determine the website approach (dependent on the level of city involvement)
  - Right now there is dual maintenance with the city page & our own site.
  - Is the city site good enough that we could replicate our structure & have support from them on issues?
    - Would remove our own website cost potentially
    - Would require a migration effort to shift everything so we still have the historical documents & posts
  - If we keep our existing page, would it make sense to look at upgrading to another platform in place of wordpress?
    - If we have the budget, we could look to modernize & upgrade to newer technology.
- 2. Getting more connected
  - Have a contact within each of the committees to help coordinate postings
    - Want to ensure word is getting out for all meetings
    - Z&V is good on this & when there are elections, we get that info
  - Reaching the broader community
    - With the loss of more print media in the neighborhood, fewer outlets available to spread the word
    - Are there creative ways to get more outreach besides the social media platforms
- 3. Other topics for discussion
  - Virtual Meeting structure handling hybrid meetings
    - Ways to take in questions from those watching remotely comments or feed within chat
    - Likely hard to make it talking back & forth on the video
  - Online Elections
    - Could there be a way to do this assuming city approval?
    - Think about controls that would need to be in place
  - Surveys/Fact Finding
    - Pulling together critical items to then outreach to the community for feedback
    - Could revolve around potential developments or general improvements they'd want to see
- 4. Open Forum
