2. CV23-045, 299 Walhalla Rd.

Note: This property is located on the east side of Gudrun Road, directly north of the property addressed 332 Gudrun Road (010-303217). In order to build a garage on the lot, the applicant seeks the following variances:

- 1. CC3332.035, R-3, Residential District, to permit an accessory structure (private garage) on a parcel off-site of the primary parcel with the single-family dwelling to which the proposed garage is accessory.
- 2. CC3332.05(A)(4), Area District Lot Width Requirements, to permit construction of a building on a lot with a width measured a the front lot line of less than 50' by reducing 50' to 0' because the existing parcel doesn't front on a public street, as defined, but abuts two alleys.
- 3. CC3332.13, R-3 Area District Requirements, to reduce lot area from 5,000 SF to 3,049 SF (0.070 ac) to permit a detached garage as a principal building on an existing parcel.
- 4. CC3332.19, Fronting, to permit the construction of a detached garage on an existing parcel without street frontage
- 5. CC3332.26, Minimum Side Yard Permitted, to reduce the minimum side

yard at the southeast corner of the proposed garage from 3' to 1' - 5'', due to the irregular shape of the parcel.

3. Christine Parman from the zoning department helped answer question about parcel and zoning/variance rules

Public Comment:

- Neighbors voiced opinions and made statements both for and against the project
 - Neighbors against the project objected to impact to environment/trees as cited by arborist; lack of true hardship; difficulty of emergency vehicles being able to get to the area
 - Neighbors for the project preferred new garage that blended into environment versus current situation of cars parking on dirt pad

Commissioners comment:

- All variances were voted on as a single vote
- Noted that because what was being proposed was an Accessory Dwelling Unit that this required variances. If a new home were to be built on the parcel zoning/variances might not be required.
- Commissioners in approval of the project strongly encouraged the downslab and sonotubes to help preserve the mature oak trees on the property
- Commissioners concerned about the project wanted to preserve the unique landscape of the ravine and mature trees in the area
